Friday, November 13, 2020, 12:00 Noon, EST

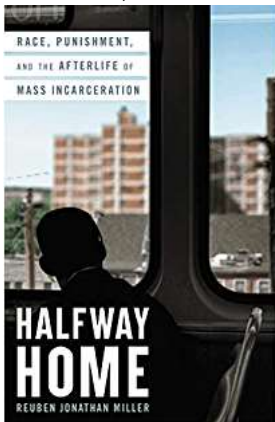
