Co-PI Robert W. Turner II, PhD and Co-I Tam Perry, PhD, along with Co-PIs Drs. Monica Rivera-Mindt and Mary Carrillo received a notice of award (NOA) from the National Institute on Aging (NIA) for a 3-year R13 Super Bowl conference grant. The aims of this multidisciplinary conference series are: (1) to identify knowledge gaps and future priorities in cognitive reserve, resilience, aging, and AD/ABRD health disparities life course research among Black males; (2) to cultivate a culturally competent workforce trained and committed to addressing Black male's brain health, cognitive aging, and

AD/ABRD research; and (3) to build a national research volunteer registry of Black Males. They are equally excited to be working closely with the National Football League Alumni Association and the Alzheimer's Association on this project. In fact, Dr. Carl V. Hill (PRBA Alum) and Chief Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Officer for the Alzheimer's Association, is Co-Investigator on this grant.

The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, Medicine Neuroscience Training Workshops



The COVID-19 pandemic has introduced tremendous challenges for neuroscience training, including those related to lab closings, class disruptions, and reduced job postings, in addition to the challenges currently faced by everyone in society. The past year has also seen a collective awakening around issues related to race, diversity and inclusion, with the crisis also putting a spotlight on systemic issues that predated the pandemic. This virtual workshop—the second in a series—laid out a broad framework and highlighted some of the specific dimensions contributing to the current time of uncertainty,

disruption, and stress for many neuroscience trainees, postdoctoral researchers, and their mentors, and consider changes needed across the ecosystem.

Fostering a diverse neuroscience workforce, as well as an environment that is inclusive for all, are critical to the advancement of science and the future of the field. This virtual workshop—the third in a series—tackled the broad topic of inclusion and diversity in neuroscience training to include discussions on racial equity (*expanding on themes from the [first workshop](#) in the series*), supporting a global workforce, institutional and geographic diversity, unique challenges for women in science, understanding how the goals of inclusion intersect with the goals around changing the culture of science. This workshop also considered the changes needed to move the field forward in this space.
