The official journal of APA Division 45 (Society for the Psychological Study of Culture, Ethnicity and Race), *Cultural Diversity & Ethnic Minority Psychology*[®] seeks to advance the psychological science of culture, ethnicity, and race through the publication of empirical research, as well as theoretical, conceptual, and integrative review articles that will stimulate further empirical research, on basic and applied psychological issues relevant to racial and ethnic groups that have been historically subordinated, underrepresented, or underserved.

Especially welcome are articles that

- contribute to the psychological understanding of issues related to culture, race, and ethnicity through theory-driven or community-driven research. These issues may include (but are not limited to) developmental processes, family relationships, intergroup relations, mental health and well-being, disparities in mental health, health, and education/employment, and treatment and intervention;
- involve new, innovative or underutilized research and statistical methods and paradigms. These approaches may include development or cultural adaptation of psychological measures, laboratory experiments, community-based participatory research, meta-analyses, mixed-methods and qualitative, longitudinal, cross-national, and biological and genetic approaches;
- apply psychological science to the education and training of psychologists in matters regarding persons from diverse cultural, racial, and ethnic backgrounds, including delivery of evidence-based interventions to racial and ethnic groups that have been underrepresented and underserved; and
- critique and promote better science, public policy and service delivery through appropriate application of psychological theory and research on culture, ethnicity, and race. These articles may involve new theory or conceptualization and integrative reviews.

Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Substance Abuse Charles R. Drew University

CDU is seeking an extraordinary and dedicated post-doctoral fellow interested in performing research in the intersections of neuroscience, epidemiology, health disparities, and substance abuse for this joint post-doctoral opportunity. Fellowships are usually for two years, with a possible third year.

This postdoc position will be a part of the Next Generation Substance Abuse Disorders Research Training (SART) at CDU and UCLA R25 grant funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (Grant no. 1R25DA050723-01A1). The SART program focuses on training researchers at all stages of their career in substance abuse disorder research, responsible conduct of research, and career advancement with a novel emphasis on community engagement and dissemination. As the program comprises a partnership between CDU and UCLA, which are about 20 miles apart, the post-doctoral fellow will have the opportunity for training at CDU and/or UCLA.

The postdoc will work with Dr. Shervin Assari (PRBA Network) and he has noted the target for this fellowship is diverse scholars with disadvantaged backgrounds, racial and ethnic minorities, and LGBT individuals. If they want to work with me, they can do 1) social epidemiology, 2) psychology, or 3) neuroscience. If they work with him, they can count on about 10 papers per year, which will definitely boost their transition to a faculty position. He notes - We will closely help the individual to transition to a faculty position with a good chance of working for CDU after the postdoc is over.
