### **2022 ICPSR Summer Program**

**Register by May 15<sup>th</sup> and SAVE!!!**

This year's ICPSR Summer Program will be held in a hybrid format, with in-person classes for those who can attend in Ann Arbor and online access in either a synchronous or asynchronous mode. Every lecture is recorded too, so you can watch on your own time, or review what you saw in class earlier. The dates for the main four-week sessions will extend from June 20 to July 15 for the first session, and from July 18 to August 12 for the second session. We are adding short workshops starting in May and running through August as their schedules are firmed up. ICPSR is offering 80+ workshops in statistics, quantitative methods, & data analysis.

Special short workshops on topics of race, ethnicity, and DEI:

#### **Quantitative Methods to Advance Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion | May 23-27, 2022**

Instructor: Matthew Diemer (University of Michigan)

This workshop centers latent variable modeling as a strategy to address and advance diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI). This workshop actively interweaves social identities (e.g., race/ethnicity, gender, and social class) and equity with quantitative concepts, instead of distancing methods from the lived experiences of students and larger societal issues.

#### **Racial Attitudes, Racial Identities, and Politics | June 20-24, 2022**

Instructor: Ashley Jardina (Duke University)

This workshop will focus on the nature of racial attitudes and racial identities across different racial groups, and it will consider the ways in which these constructs have been important for understanding political attitudes and behavior over time.

#### **Cultural and Structural Racism: Developing and Testing Theories and Frameworks | August 1-5, 2022**

Instructor: Margaret Hicken (University of Michigan)

In this workshop, students will learn interdisciplinary approaches to the study of cultural and structural racism and its link to racial inequities in numerous factors over place and time, including the ways in which historical racial violence may be linked to contemporary factors.

The mission of the Summer Institute is to provide rigorous and high quality graduate training in all phases of survey research. The program teaches state-of-the-art practice and theory in the design, implementation, and analysis of surveys. The Summer Institute in Survey Research Techniques has presented courses on the sample survey since the summer of 1948, and has offered such courses every summer since. The Summer Institute uses the sample survey as the basic instrument for the scientific measurement of human activity. It presents sample survey methods in courses designed to meet the educational needs of those specializing in social and behavioral research such as professionals in business, public health, natural resources, law, medicine, nursing, social work, and many other domains of study. [The Health and Retirement Study](https://hrsonline.isr.umich.edu) (hrsonline.isr.umich.edu) June workshop is intended to give participants an introduction to the study that will enable them to get started using the data for research. HRS is a large-scale longitudinal study with more than 20 years of data on the labor force participation and health transitions that individuals undergo toward the end of their work lives and in the years that follow. **The workshop is now being offered at two levels: introductory and advanced/intermediate.** The June workshop will be taught at the introductory level and is intended for users who have little to no experience using HRS data. The advanced/intermediate workshop will be offered each year in December. Please email the instructor if you have any questions about which course is appropriate for you. The June workshop is offered online.
